- **Sustainable Development Goals :** The Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face, including those related to poverty, inequality, climate change, environmental degradation, peace and justice. The 17 Goals are all interconnected, and in order to leave no one behind, it is important that we achieve them all by 2030.

Warli painting is a form of [tribal art](#) mostly created by the tribal people from the North [Sahyadri Range](#) in Maharashtra, India.

These rudimentary [wall paintings](#) use a set of basic geometric shapes: a circle, a triangle, and a square. These shapes are symbolic of different elements of nature. The circle and the triangle come from their observation of nature. The circle represents the sun and the moon, while the triangle depicts mountains and conical trees. In contrast, the square renders to be a human invention, indicating a sacred enclosure or a piece of land. Using the A3 sheet draw and colour one drawing based on Warli Painting.
