Personality Development

a) **About yourself** – Name, age, class, birthday, parent's name, school name, best friend, favourite dish, favourite colour, programme, cartoon, movie.

Objective – To enable the child to speak 5-8 lines on himself/herself.

Activities

b) **Self management/ Personal hygiene**
